Schedule

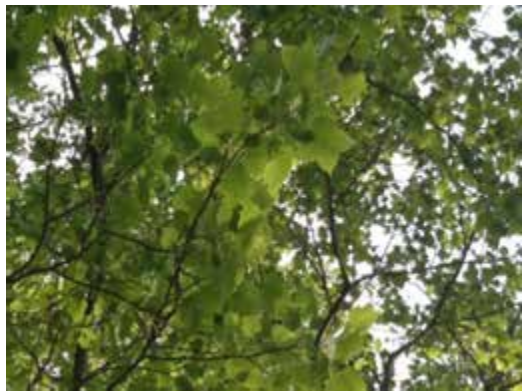
- Saturday

 - 8:00 PM - Evening snack

Reflection

- About 40% participation
- Schedule time slots for each patrol for activities results.

- Could get together for a Sunday morning check in and Scout's Own
- Families really got involved.
 - Younger siblings slept out
 - Scouts cooked for their families
 - Parents watched the campfire
 - Parents helped with the Scout's activities
 - Lots of pictures posted to the Troop Shutterfly

Reflection - Zoom Campfire

- Requires a MC
- Requires someone to run the Zoom meeting
- Songs require a song leader willing to sing solo.
- Skits with multiple members are possible, but require planning. Only one person can speak at a time.
 - Who's on First.
 - The Infant Tree
- Patrols can edit Zoom snips together for a pre-recorded skit.
- Recognition is limited to chat and Zoom clapping symbol

Reflection - Challenges

- Not all families have tents, camp stoves or firepits
- Some families are not able to camp at their house
- Cooking outside challenging for some families
- Rain is an issue, many families do not have a dining fly
- Requires the Scouts to challenge themselves
- Coming up with interesting activities is taking more creativity.
